Newburgh, NY (February 2<sup>nd</sup>, 2012) – The Greater Hudson Valley Family Health Center (GHVFHC) is proud to announce that it has been recognized as Level 3 Patient Centered Medical Home from the National Committee for Quality Assurance (NCQA). Level 3 designation is the highest achievable recognition for a medical group. NCQA's Patient Centered Medical Home program recognizes physician practices that prioritize the strengthening of the physician-patient relationship, coordinate care for patients across multiple settings, and engage in a team approach to improve patient care.

"The patient –centered medical home promises to improve health and health care" said GHVFHC President & CEO Linda S. Muller. "The active, on-going relationship between a patient and a clinician in medical homes fosters an all-to-rare goal in care: staying healthy and preventing illnesses in the first place. PCMH Recognition shows that GHVFHC has the tools, systems, and resources to provide their patients with the right care at the right time."

Our medical home program has excelled at improving patient's access to health care, improving communication with patients, and improving the quality of care patients receive. According to Dr. Alan Bernstein, Chief Medical Officer of the Greater Hudson Valley Family Health Center, "We have utilized our electronic health records to track test results, to follow patient referrals, to identify patients in need of follow up care for ongoing medical problems, and to reach out to patients who would benefit from more aggressive health care management."
