

FQHC 2010 Performance on HRSA Clinical Quality Measures

HRSA tracks federally qualified health centers (FQHCs) against the Healthy People 2020 goals for six clinical quality measures:

- Children's immunization rate
- PAP test for female patients
- First-trimester prenatal care
- Low-birthweight births among patients
- Diabetic patients under 9% on A1c
- Hypertensive patients under 140/90

The 2010 UDS reported these values for 51 health centers in NYS: 30 in NYC and 21 elsewhere in the state. The following table shows the number of NYS centers whose 2010 patient outcomes fall short of the US average as reported in a recent *Kaiser Health News* chart.¹

Health centers in New York State compared quite favorably to the nation at large, based on the number of measures (out of six) for which a center failed to match the national population. As shown below, only about one in five NYS FQHCs fell short of the national values on a majority of the six measures. On the other hand, five out of six NYS FQHCs fell short of the general population value on at least two of the six measures.

¹ National values were derived from federal reporting systems and surveys of the general population from 2003 through 2008. FQHC data were derived from patients who received treatment in 2010.
