



## LEGISLATIVE MEETING INSTRUCTIONS

### WHOM TO VISIT FIRST

- Senators and Assemblymembers representing your community, homeless or migrant health center(s)
- Legislators from the area where you live

You must arrange your appointments with your legislators in advance in order to ensure that you will be seen by them.

### WHAT TO DO

- If you don't have an appointment, ask if it is possible to see the legislator.
- If the legislator is not available, ask to meet with the staff in charge of health issues.

### WHAT TO SAY

1. Start with introductions - your name, where you live and the name of the health center(s) you represent.
2. Say you are here for the Community Health Center Grassroots Advocacy Day.
3. Thank the legislator for his/her past support.
4. Explain why your health center is important to you (sharing your personal story may be the most important tool you can use to get support from a legislator).
5. Refer to the "Talking Points" sheet(s) in your packet for important issues to highlight during your meetings.
6. Leave behind a legislative packet.
7. End by thanking him/her for meeting with you!
