Uncompensated Care Program Funding for Uninsured Visits

\$54.4 Million in contingency funding to fill the gap created by the loss of 2015 Federal Indigent Care Funding

New York State did not secure from CMS the renewal of the Clinic Uncompensated Care Program federal match. The match expired at the end of 2014 and as a result, FQHCs and other safety net providers are experiencing a **50% cut in 2015 indigent care funding.** If the match is not secured, this 50% gap will continue into 2016-17.

Investments in Community-Based Providers to Support Transformation Efforts

- Allocate \$49M of the proposed Health Care Facility Transformation Funding to Community Health Care Providers
- Create a \$88.5M Essential Community Health Care Provider Fund Exclusively for Community Health Care Providers
- > Add \$20M to the Community Health Care Revolving Capital Fund

The SFY 2015-16 budget allocated less than 4% of the nearly \$1.7 billion in new health care funding to non-hospital community-based health care providers, including FQHCs.

To align with the State's goal of reducing unnecessary hospitalizations by 25%, a minimum of 25% of all health care investments should be allocated to community health care providers.

Health Care for New York's Most Vulnerable: Migrant Farmworkers

> Appropriate \$430,000 for Migrant Health Care programs

The Executive Budget appropriates \$406,000 to Migrant Health Care programs. Adding \$24,000 would restore funding to SFY 2012-13 levels for these critical programs.
