Health Care for New York's Most Vulnerable: Migrant Farmworkers

Appropriate \$430,000 for Migrant Health Care Programs

- The Executive Budget appropriates \$406,000 to Migrant Health Care programs. **Adding \$24,000 would restore funding to SFY 2012-13 levels.**
- Since 2012, when state funding for Migrant Health Care programs was reduced, FQHCs have seen a **15% increase in the number of migrant and seasonal agricultural workers served**, yet funding levels have remained stagnant.
- Migrant Health Care funding allows health centers and other eligible providers to serve over 21,000 migrant and seasonal agricultural workers and their families, an extremely vulnerable population that is integral to New York State's agribusiness.
- It is estimated that **61 percent of farmworkers live in poverty**, with a median income of less than \$11,000 annually.
- New York's migrant health centers keep farmworkers healthy by providing primary and preventive health care services, including culturally competent outreach, interpretation, transportation, health education and dental care.
- FQHCs have experienced **exponential growth in the number of migrant and seasonal agricultural workers they serve.** Between 2008 and 2014, the number of migrant workers served by FQHCs increased by more than 35%.
