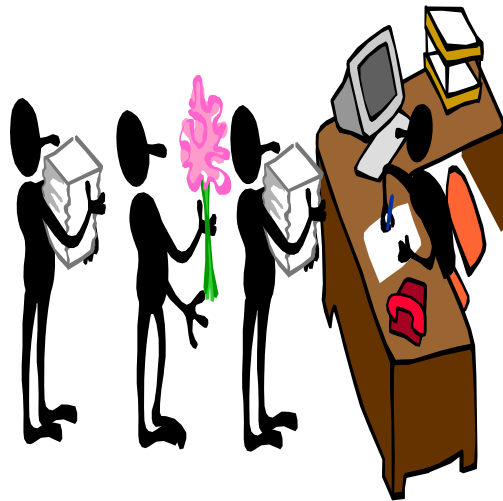

Project LINK

- \$ from SAMHSA, OASAS and NYC DOHMH partnered with the Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, and Transgender Community Center to deliver SBIRT in 3 NYC STD clinics between February 2008 and September 30, 2012
 - Chelsea (Manhattan)
 - Fort Greene (Brooklyn)
 - Morrisania (Bronx)



CUMULATIVE PROJECT RESULTS

FEBRUARY 08 – March 2012

	All STD Clinics
Total Patients Screened	150,121
Patients Screening Positive	25,272 (17%)
Patients Receiving an Intervention	15,031 (59% of positives)
Patients Accepting Some Referral	3,455 (23% of interventions)
Patients Accepting a Referral to Substance Abuse Treatment	854 (25% of interventions)



Expansion and Sustainability

- NYC DOHMH used its own funds to expand services into 3 additional STD clinics
 - Crown Heights (Brooklyn)
 - Jamaica (Queens)
 - Central Harlem (Manhattan)
- SAMSHA funding via NYSBIRT project expand to three more STD sites



NYSBIRT Project

- **One of nine awards made by SAMSHA for the 4th cohort of SBIRT grantees**
- **Awarded to NYS OASAS**
- **September 2011 to August 2016**
- **Total award \$8.3 million**



NYSBIRT Project Goals

- **Expand SBIRT services to public health clinics and military populations**
- **Establish SBIRT as routine practice and a standard of care for public health clinic and military populations**



NYSBIRT Project Goals

- **Decrease prevalence of substance use disorders**
- **Develop a system to bill Medicaid and other insurance for SBIRT**
- **Increase the ability of medical staff to perform SBIRT**



NYSBIRT Project Strategies

- 1. Demonstrate service models in two historically underserved populations:**
 - NYC STD Clinics**
 - Military Personnel and their Families in Jefferson County, NY**

- 2. Expand service throughout NYS and develop policies to sustain SBIRT services through PAC**



NYSBIRT Services

NYC - Six STD clinics:

- **Year 1: Jamaica, Crown Heights, Central Harlem**
- **Year 2: Chelsea, Morrisania, Fort Greene
Jefferson County (Fort Drum area)**
- **Alcohol and Substance Abuse Council**
- **Samaritan Hospital Emergency Room**
- **Carthage Hospital Emergency Room**



NYSBIRT Protocol

- **Screen using AUDIT and DAST**
- **Conduct Brief Intervention**
- **Conduct Brief Treatment**
- **Refer to Treatment**
- **Conduct GPRA interviews**

Mission of the PAC

- establish SBIRT as a permanent and inseparable element of primary care services across NYS in a wide array of settings and for the full spectrum of patients across all social and economic groups.



At the end of 2016, NYS will have accomplished the following:

- Strong performance in both of the project sites in terms of people screened and served and capacity built.
- A track record of expanding SBIRT implementation
- An established infrastructure to support SBIRT as a standard practice in primary care. This infrastructure will include:
 - An ongoing centralized workgroup of state staff and advisors
 - Linkages with relevant systems
 - An ongoing marketing and messaging campaign
 - Sufficient training and technical assistance resources
 - Payer criteria and benefits established to support SBIRT as standard benefit
