We are collaborating with the NYMAC state Chapters of the American Academy of Family Physicians and the American College of Physicians to invite a very select number of second-year residents and faculty advisors who are interested in providing care to adult patients with genetic conditions from the NYMAC states and District of Columbia to attend this one-day conference. Attendees will also include doctors in family medicine, med-peds and internal medicine who have been recognized for their interest in caring for these patients.

This all-expense-paid event is sponsored by NYMAC. It will include presentations by an expert panel of providers who are dedicated to the successful transition of young adults with genetic disease from pediatric to adult-oriented medical care. The talks will be followed by an open discussion with adults who will share their experiences transitioning from pediatric to adult-oriented care. The conference will conclude with a Q&A session with many of the presenters.

We have made arrangements with the hotel for conference attendees to stay at the hotel at their expense on Saturday night at the government rate of \$147 plus taxes and fees if they so wish.
