

FQHC Fast Facts

- Federally qualified health centers (FQHCs) are **New York's primary care safety net providers.**
- FQHCs are not-for-profit, community-based clinics **located in medically underserved areas.**
- FQHCs provide high quality, cost effective primary and preventative care to anyone seeking care, regardless of their insurance status or ability to pay.
- There are over **60 FQHCs** in New York that operate more than **600 sites**.
- Each FQHC is governed by a consumer-majority board of directors.
- FQHCs serve 1.7 million New Yorkers annually.
- Patient demographics at New York's FQHCs:
 - 86% have incomes below 200% of poverty.
 - More than half receive Medicaid.
 - One quarter are best served in a language other than English.
 - Three-fourths are racial and/or ethnic minorities.
