Testing, Treatment, and Prevention: The Clinician's Role in Ending the AIDS Epidemic in New York State

These half-day conferences will focus on the Governor Cuomo's Plan to End the AIDS Epidemic by 2020 and highlight the role of medical providers in (1) identifying people with HIV who remain undiagnosed and linking them to healthcare; (2) linking and retaining people diagnosed with HIV to health care and getting them on anti-HIV therapy to maximize HIV virus suppression so they remain healthy and prevent further transmission; and (3) providing access to pre-exposure prophylaxis (PrEP) for high-risk people to keep them HIV-negative.
