


HHHN Background & Intro

Care Management



"At Hudson Headwaters, Care Managers are members of the health care team that assist individuals living with chronic conditions meet their health care goals. Care Managers work alongside the primary care, specialty care and behavioral health care team to provide health coaching and coordination. They help patients better understand their conditions, health care goals and medications. Navigating the health care system can be challenging; Care Managers provide education and support to help patients overcome this challenge. In addition, they can assist patients with accessing community resources and supports to improve their overall health and wellness."



The Care Manager Role

- Care Managers (CMs) print the medication lists along with the problem lists and document which meds are for what problems to make sense for the patient as to why they are taking each medication.
- CMs ask patients to bring their medications in so they can go through them together and ensure all are being taken properly.
- If the patient has medication allergies, the CM will print up the list of medications this covers so there is no confusion (I.e. NSAIDS)
- If a patient cannot afford the needed medication, the CM will work with RX Assist or other entities (i.e. North Country Ministries) to help fund the medication.
- CMs will work with pharmacies and patients to get bubble packs of multiple medications made up for those that have trouble managing their daily meds

Karen's Success Story





In our geographic location, within 5,600 square miles of mountain country, sometimes the only places for patients to go when they need help is our health centers – and we always strive to best meet their needs.

For Hudson Headwaters, Population Health began in 1974 when Dr. Rugge understood he needed the help and partnerships of pediatricians and internists to provide the best health care to his patients. From there, when the last practicing dentist retired in Warrensburg, NY, he turned his office over to HHHN and we began a dental practice. This then began conversations stating, "If we are now seeing dental as part of primary care, we should introduce things like podiatry as well." Once this happened, then came Behavioral Health, and we now have 19 providers within the network with BH. Obstetrics followed closely behind with a need for early prenatal care in the region.

Because HHHN has recognized this need for so many years, we have created and grown so many partnerships throughout our region to promote patient care and coordination.
