HIV rapid treatment has been shown to improve retention in care and less time to a suppressed viral load – are you offering this at your site? If yes, what were the challenges and how have staff and patients responded? If not, what are the barriers?

Some sites report that **self-swabbing for STD screening** improves rates of three site testing – are you offering this at your site? If yes, how does it work and what is the workflow for patients? In any event, what are the downsides?

Does your health center have a **policy** around pharmaceutical company employees and their access to the site and especially prescribers? How and to what extent do pharmaceutical companies influence prescribing practices?

Does your health center prescribe **PrEP**? How do you assess quality of this program?

Have you prepared your submission for **HIVQUAL 2017?** How has your experience been this year?

Do you follow AIDS Institute guidelines and screen for anal cancer with anal pap tests? Discuss your site's ability to access follow up high resolution anoscopy for abnormalities.

U=U is a powerful, new message based on carefully gathered evidence. How has it, or how do you think in time it will, change the way an HIV+ patient experiences care at your health center?

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
