




# Strategic Funding Breakdown



#### Strategic Funding on an Annual Basis




#### **FY08: The First Piece of the Pie**

## **How Did NY Delegation Do?**

#### **FY2008** Appropriations Sign-on Letters

#### **Stabenow-Bond**

Both Senator Clinton and Senator Schumer signed onto letter

#### **Pallone-Deal**

21 out of 29 Members signed onto letter

### What are the Next Steps on Appropriations?

- Full House passed the LHHS funding bill on July 19<sup>th</sup>, 276-140. Health Centers received a \$200 million increase
- Senate Appropriations Committee passed a \$250 million increase
- Full Senate hasn't acted House/Senate conference won't happen until later this year
- ➢ Not a Done Deal: Presidential Veto looming
  - Your help is needed to keep the pressure on for increased Health Centers funding

#### **Health Centers Reauthorization**

#### Preserve and protect cornerstone elements

- Include funding targets that put Health Centers on the path to 30 million by 2015
- Continue to build Congressional support towards enactment this year
- Eliminate challenges to passage this year



#### Reauthorization

#### Health Centers Renewal Act (HR 1343/S 901)

- Senate Authors: HELP Committee Chairman Ted Kennedy (D-MA) Sen. Orrin Hatch (R-UT)
- House Authors: Rep. Gene Green (D-TX) Rep. Charles "Chip" Pickering (R-MS)
- Provides for a straight 5yr reauthorization of CHCs
- Keeps all key pillars of the program's success
- Calls for specific growth targets
- Current House Cosponsors 230, Senate Cosponsors 69

### **Key Challenges for 2007**

#### Protecting Core Elements of the Health Centers Program:

- 51% Patient Majority Board
- Open to All
- Location in MUAs
- Comprehensive Services

#### Support for continuation & growth

- 5 year reauthorization
- Funding levels to put health centers on a path to serve 30 million by 2015

#### Minimizing Obstacles to Reauthorization

- -- Ascension Draft Demo Proposal
- -- Shoring up Support for Funding
- -- Anticipating Member Concerns

## **Next Steps on Reauthorization?**

- NACHC continuing to work with Senate HELP and House Energy and Commerce Committee on the timing, size and shape of reauthorization package
- House and Senate Action Likely in October
  - Your Help will be needed in August and September to urge Members to reauthorize the program
- Consideration by the full House and Senate
- Congress Should Renew Other Key Programs
  - National Health Service Corps

### **SCHIP Reauthorization**

SCHIP is still likely to be reauthorized this year, but lawmakers differ on a number of policy issues.

# **SCHIP Reauthorization- the Latest**

#### Senate: Finance Committee Bill

- Passed \$35 billion package earlier this year
- Maintains Coverage for all 6.6 kids on SCHIP
- Extends care to 3.2 million low-income, uninsured children
- Funded through an increase in tobacco tax
- House: Energy and Commerce/Ways and Means Package, H.R. 3162, Children's Health and Medicare Protection Act
  - Passed \$50 billion package earlier this year
  - Extends care to additional 5-6 million children
  - Funded through Medicare provisions and tobacco tax



House and Senate worked on compromise

#### Included creation of Health Center PPS under SCHIP!!

Closer to Senate passed version of SCHIP package

≻ House passed September 25 by a vote of 265-159

Senate passed September 27 by a vote of 67-29

President expected to veto legislation

# **Medicare Payment Cap**

- Medicare Adjustment to Community Health Centers (MATCH) Act
  - House Bill is H.R. 2897 10 cosponsors NY cosponsors needed. Senate bill introduced early October.
    - Creates a Medicare Prospective Payment System (PPS) for health centers based on the actual costs of delivering care.
    - -Based on Medicaid PPS payment structure.
    - Updates Medicare FQHC benefit package to include all Medicare-covered services at a health center.
    - Efforts to add a study of a Medicare PPS to SCHIP package





Priority: Bringing Health Center employees into the Federal Employees Health Benefits Program





- Community Health Centers Into Expanded FEHBP (CHIEF) Act (HR1518)
  - -H.R. 1518 has 31 cosponsors need NY cosponsors
  - -Senate bill introduced early October
  - Allows health centers to participate in the Federal Employee Health Benefits Program enabling them to provide insurance to their own employees at a reasonable cost and use the federal funds they receive for their original intent – helping those in need.
  - -Goal: build support and momentum for action next year
