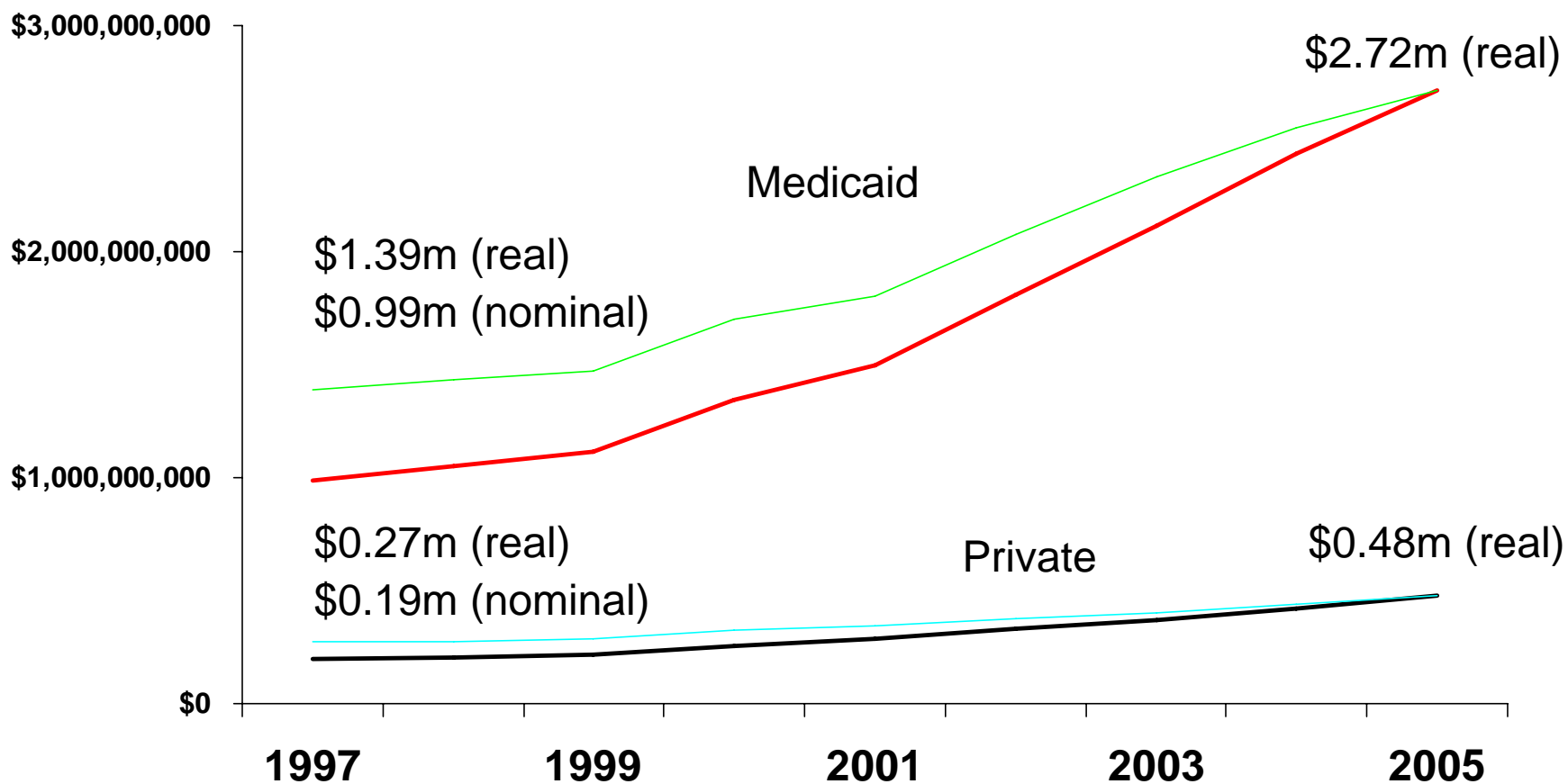
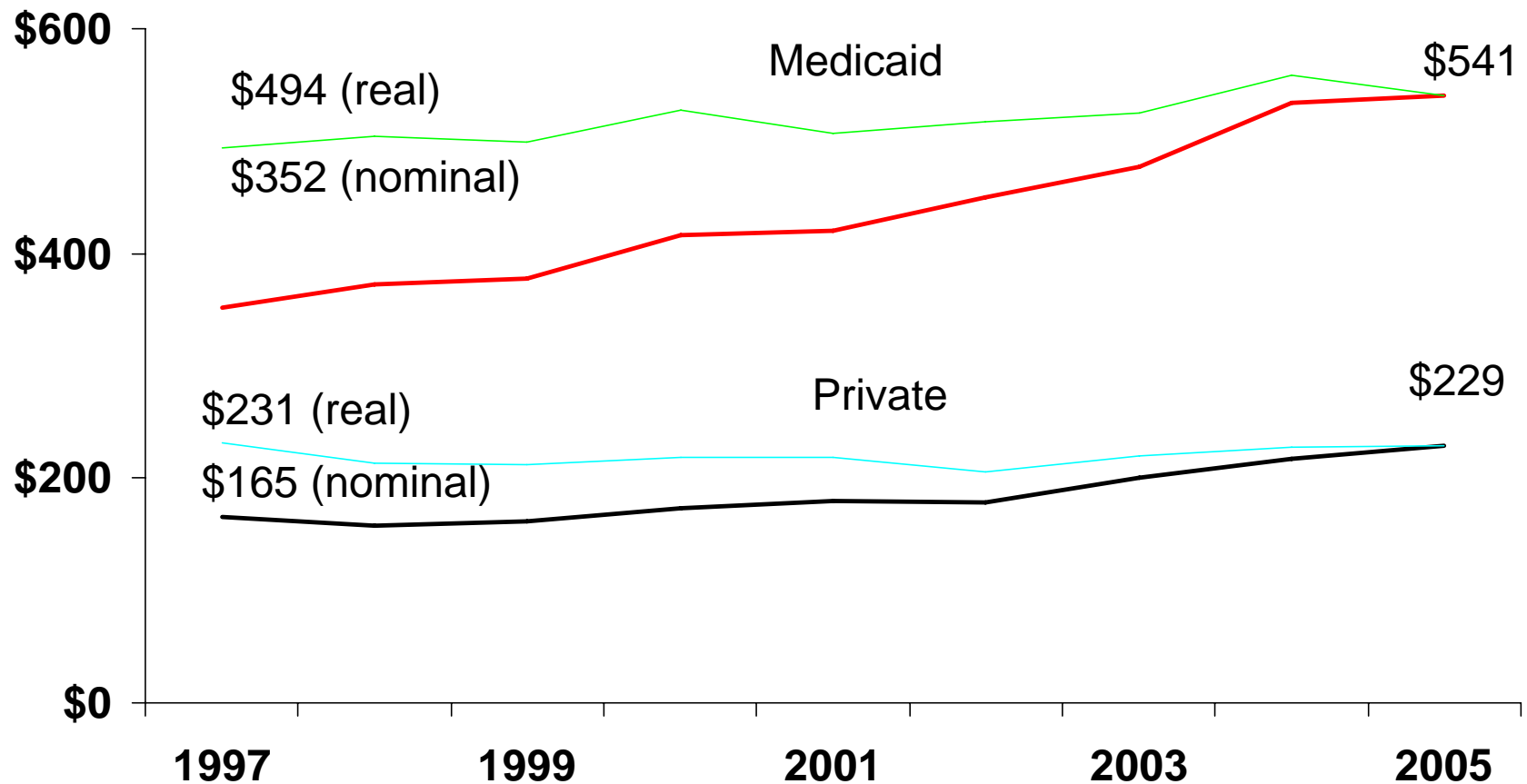


1. Growth in Medicaid and Private Health Insurance Revenues, 1997-2005



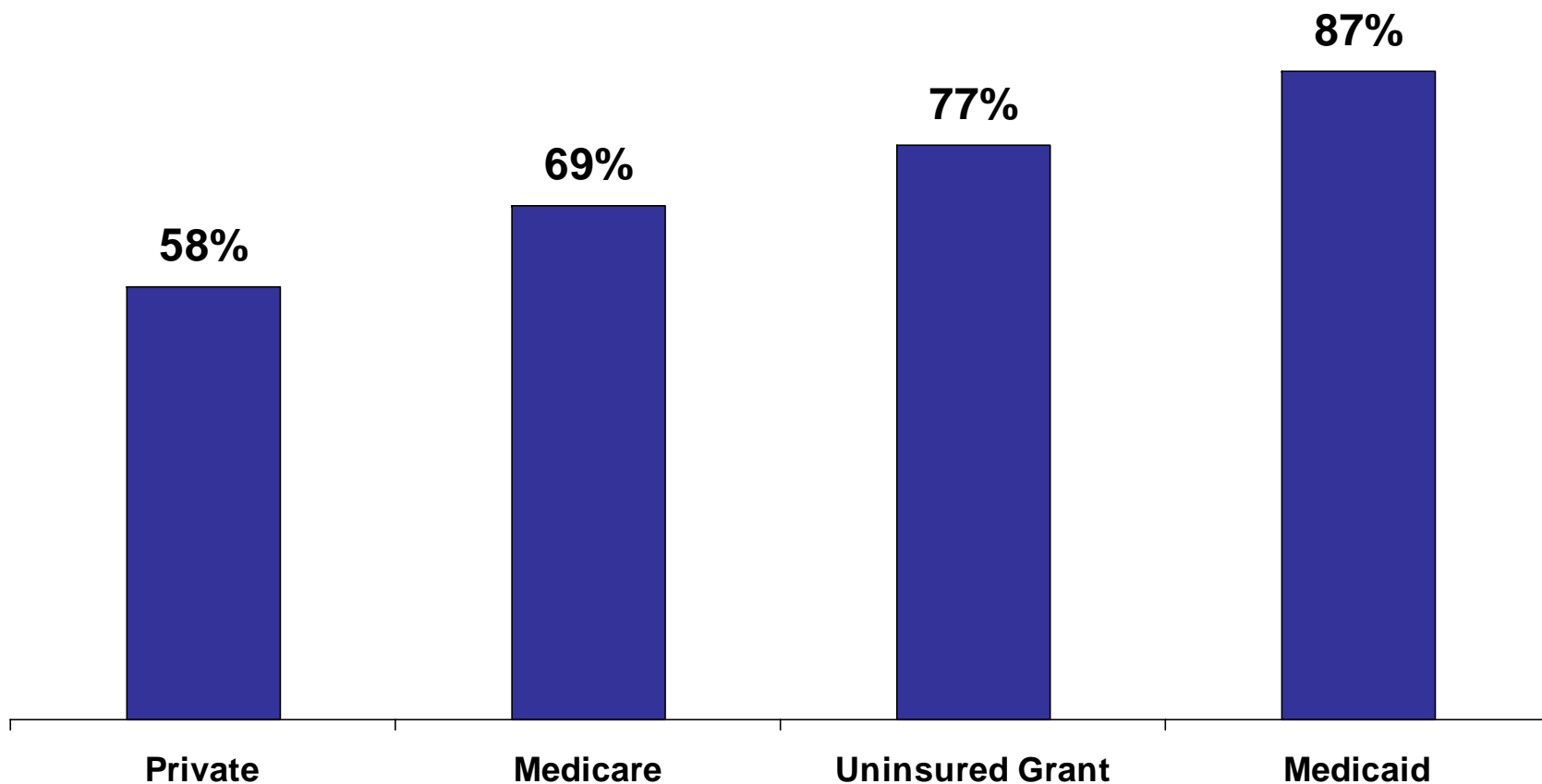

2. Growth in Health Center Per Patient Revenue, Medicaid and Private Health Insurance, 1997-2005



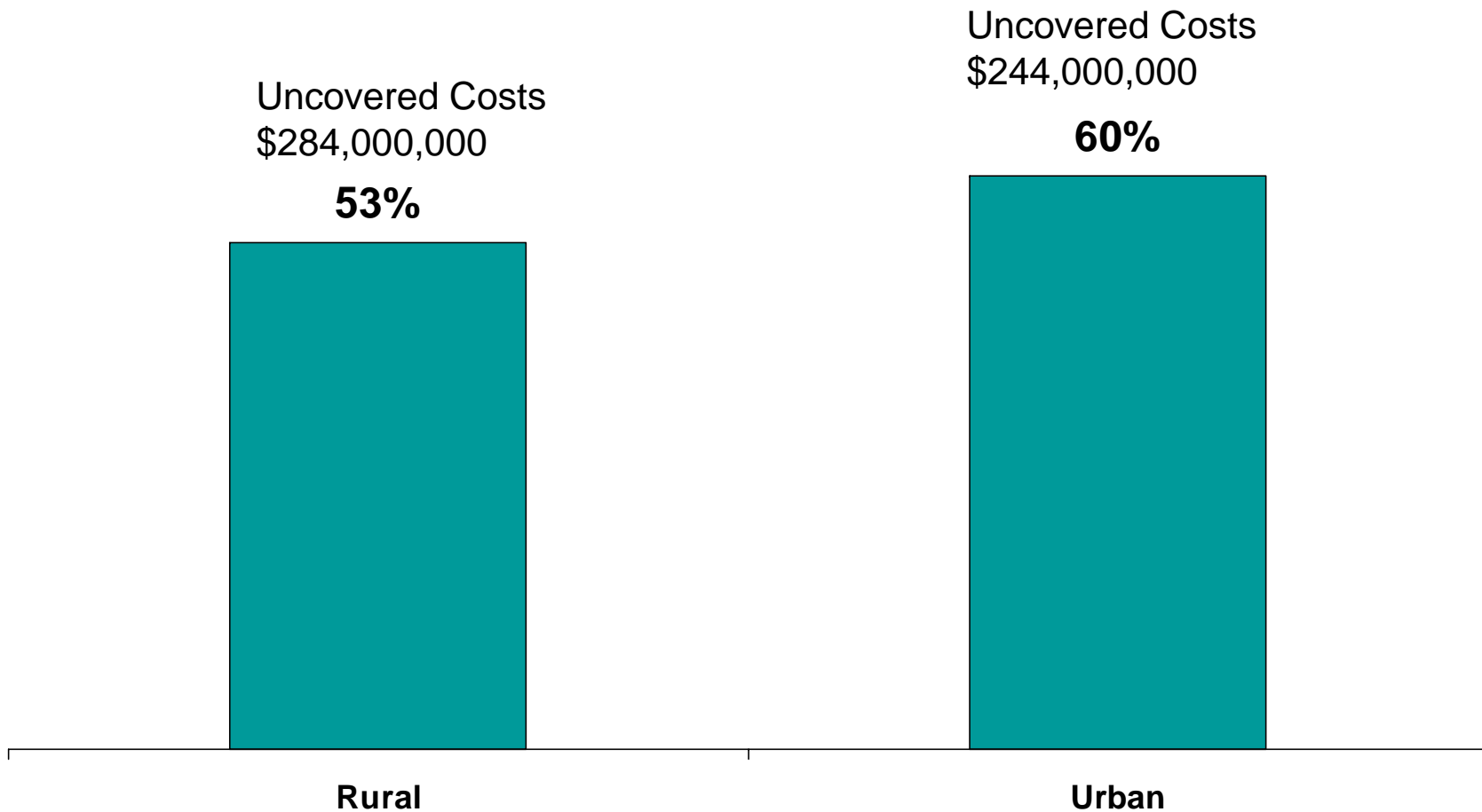

3. Ratio of Health Center Revenues by Payer Source to Charges, 2005



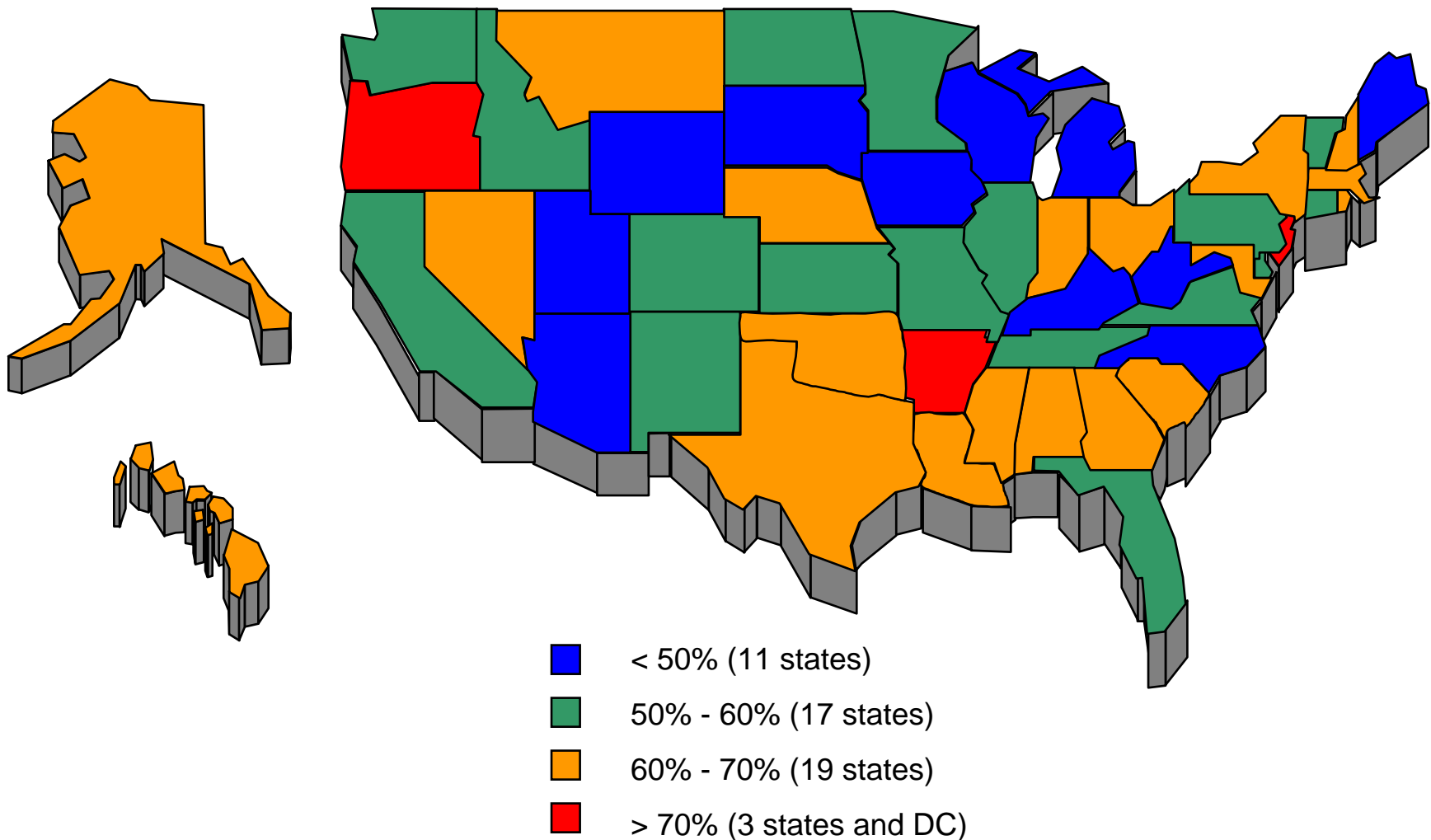

4. Private Health Insurance Shortfalls as a Percentage of Uncovered Costs, Urban and Rural Health Centers, 2004



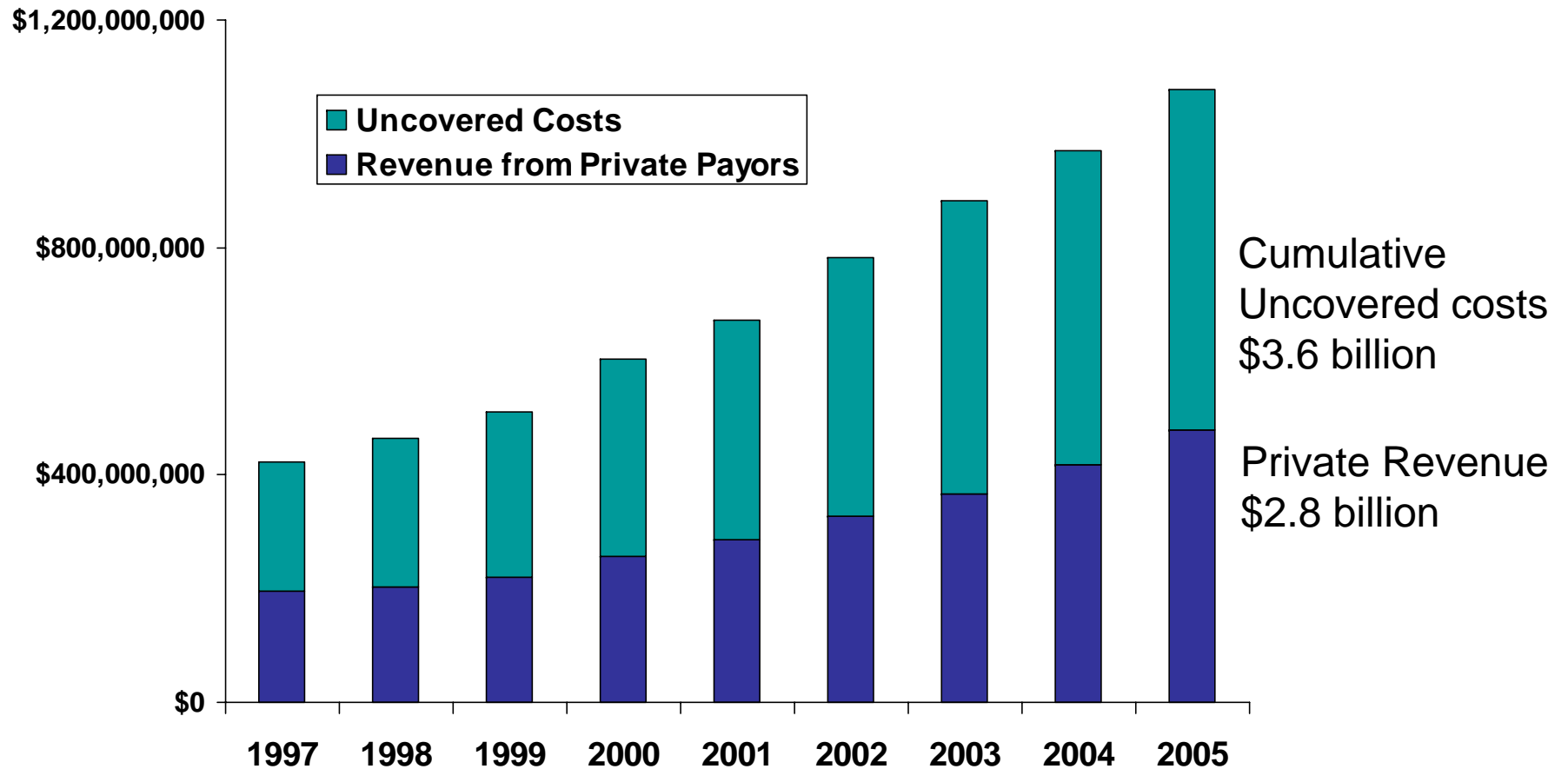
