We will go over the meaning of the immigrant eligibility categories established in 1996 in the welfare reform legislation.</i></p> <p><i>Participants will also be provided with sample immigration documents that can verify immigration status in order to be able to better identify for which particular medical assistance programs an individual immigrant might be eligible.
