Building a Successful Mobile Health Program

- What is a Mobile Health Program?
 - A program that delivers health care in non traditional settings using mobile vehicles
 - Services may include medical, dental, behavioral health, radiology, specialty care etc.

Phases in Developing a Mobile Health Program

- Phase I: Needs Assessment
- Phase II: Clinic Construction
- Phase III: Certification and Licensure
- Phase IV: Supporting Ongoing Clinic Needs

Phase I Needs Assessment

• Available resources:

Consider Government and Foundation funding, and private fund raising

• Area/location:

Competitors;

Patient access;

Potential clientele and their healthcare needs;

Geographic area to be covered

• Services to be Provided:

Medical care; Dental care; Radiology; Specialty care; etc

Phase I Needs Assessment Continued

• Staff:

Staff buy-in is important;What is the staffing pattern (driver, clinician, support staff);Must consider the staffing pattern before construction

• **Partnering Institutions:**

Depends on the services that will be provided, population(s) that will be serviced;
Some affiliations are mandatory (e.g. hospital affiliation);
Other affiliations such as laboratory are essential (service dependent)

Phase I Needs Assessment Continued

• Time Frame:

Funding- When/how much of the funds is available?

Construction- How long

Certification- Can be lengthy

Outreach- Community, elected officials, targeted population

Phase II Clinic Construction

• **Requirement before Construction:**

A reliable vendor; A designated staff person(s) to coordinate the construction

• **Building out the Clinic** (minimum requirements):

Sink; Toilet; Exam room(s); Waiting room/area; Storage space; Handicap accessibility

Phase II Clinic Construction continued

• Other important Requirements:

Safe entrance to and from the clinic; Adequate ventilation system; Insulation (depending on location); Greening (recommended)

• Wish List:

Awning; Reception amenities; etc

• May be able to acquire used materials, such as exam tables, ship them to the manufacturer, and have them secured in place

Phase III Certification and Licensure

- Become familiar with Federal, State and Local Laws that govern mobile clinics:
 - Physical Properties- including height, weight, length;Other regulations- applicable health, environmental and fire regulations;
 - Parking;
 - Labor/union rules governing use of staff time (e.g. the driver)
- Do not depend on the manufacturer's interpretation of local rules.
- Understand how the mobile clinic will be classified for transportation and parking rules.

Phase IV Supporting the Clinic's On-Going Needs

• **On-going Needs:**

Parking and overnight power source; Fuel (including generator needs); Clinic cleaning (interior and exterior); Water tank filling and drainage; Labs and other services; Supplies; Maintenance; Salaries

- **Be comfortable that Needs Assessment is done well**
- Choose Manufacturer carefully
- License the clinic (be smart)
