

Our History

- 2002: New York State Health Foundation (NYSHealth) was established with charitable funds resulting from the conversion of Empire Blue Cross Blue Shield from a nonprofit to a for-profit corporation.
- May 2006: Foundation begins operations and begins building staff, setting strategic direction, and making grants.
- April 2009: Over 175 organizations have received grants totally approximately \$25 million. Assets currently \$270 million.



Our History

• Independent 501c but politically appointed Board of Directors.

• Grantmaking evenly divided: NYC vs Upstate.

Broad mission but targetted priority areas.



Strategic vs Responsive vs Core Support

- **Strategic Philanthropy**: Identify a Problem and Use Grant Making To Try to Solve It..
- Responsive Philanthropy: Let Grantees Identify a Problem That They Can Solve With Grant Support.
- Core Support: Choose the Lucky Few and Help Pay for the Ongoing Operations of the Organization with Grant Funds

Strategic Grantmaking

- NYSHealth has dedicated \$20M over five years to center on Expanding Health Insurance Coverage in New York State.
- NYSHealth has dedicated \$35M over five years for *Improving the Management and Prevention of Diabetes in New York State*.
- NYSHealth has dedicated \$15M over five years to supporting *Integrating Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services*.



Coverage Program

• Objective:

Reduce the number of uninsured New Yorkers

• Strategies:

- Improve decision-making with independent, nonpartisan analyses of reform options
- Make public coverage programs work better
- Stabilize and expand private coverage, especially for small groups and individuals
- Develop cost containment mechanisms to free up dollars for coverage



Diabetes Program

• Objective:

- Improve health outcomes for people with diabetes
- Stabilize the number of new cases of diabetes

• Strategies:

- Campaign to reverse the epidemic
 - Support providers in improving the clinical management of diabetes
 - Advance community-based strategies for diabetes prevention, screening, and management
 - Promote payment policies that enable providers to deliver comprehensive care for diabetes patients
- Support changes to the local environments that will promote healthy eating and physical activity



Co-occurring Disorders Program

• Objective:

- Advance an integrated system of care that is responsive to the complex needs of New Yorkers with co-occurring mental health and substance use disorders.
- Improve access to mental health and substance use services for special populations: Iraq and Afghanistan veterans and their families

• Strategy:

- Establish a Center of Excellence that will implement integrated screening, assessment, and treatment plans across the 1,233 OMHlicensed and OASAS-certified clinic in New York State's
- Support model programs that will improve access to timely primary care, mental health and substance use services for veterans and their families
- Create a knowledgeable and credible voice on improving health policy issues for returning Iraq and Afghanistan war veterans



Special Projects Fund

• Objective:

- Respond to opportunities that fit our mission, but fall outside our three program areas
- Sustain and replicate effective programs

• Strategies:

- Open RFPs to identify projects statewide
- Objective, external review processes
- Emphasis on projects that:
 - Help consumers understand and navigate the health system
 - Improve access in areas with acute shortages
 - Improve quality of care in measurable ways
 - Support and strengthen safety net providers
 - Scale up successful programs and services
 - Provide culturally appropriate programs for underserved populations
