The ScanVan will be the <u>nation's first mobile clinic</u> to provide mammograms and clinical breast exams to screen for cancer, and tuberculin skin tests and chest x-rays to screen for tuberculosis. For all positive screenings, we will also initiate and ensure follow-up treatment.

The ScanVan's services will be offered to poor and homeless New Yorkers citywide, <u>regardless of</u> <u>whether they have medical insurance</u>.

Need for Tuberculosis Screening

2001-2003:

_3436 cases of TB reported in NYC 2004

NYC Dept of Health and Mental Hygiene find that 33% of patients (general population) eligible for TB screening had not been screened

2005

New York City's TB rate (13 per 100,000 population) remains more than double the national rate (4.9)

TB and NYC's Homeless

- <u>2001-2003</u>
 - Single Adult Shelters:
 98 TB cases— <u>11 times</u> the rate of the general public
 - Family Shelters: 19 TB cases
- <u>2005</u>

 5 new cases of MDR (multi-drugresistant) TB discovered in homeless shelters

TB Persistence Among NYC's Homeless

- crowded shelters
- limited or no access to healthcare
- HIV infection/immune system suppression

Need for Breast Health Screening

- New York State has an <u>18% higher</u> breast cancer detection rate than the national average (6 /1000 women screened vs. 5.1/1000 screened)
- ✓ The detection rate within NYC is more than double the state detection rate
- ✓ the Upper East Side of Manhattan, Eastern Staten Island, much of South Brooklyn, isolated areas in Queens (particularly Bayside and the Rockaways) experience an incidence of breast cancer that is <u>15% - 50% above the citywide detection rate</u>

Breast Cancer & African-Americans

- ✓ African American women's five-year survival rate of breast cancer is 74%, compared to white women's 88%
- ✓ Despite lower incidence rate of breast cancer among African-Americans compared to whites, African-American women
 - Have a higher fatality rate from cancer
 Are more likely to be diagnosed with larger tumors and at more advanced stages of breast cancer

Barriers to care


- Shortage of Availability **Increased demand for mammograms** A Long waits for mammography \wedge 40 days = Average wait in NYC Travel Difficulties Mammography is an expensive service ▲ requiring referrals outside ▲ non-compliance
- Cultural Inhibitions




Tuberculosis Screening

What Happens After the Film is Taken....

- ✓ Technologist confirms with patient that image is satisfactory
- Patient informed of follow-up protocol and discharged
- ✓ Film forwarded to radiologist for reading
- Results and image forwarded to patient's provider
 (Positive results are expedited through process)

Lets talk about Positives or 'Re-Takes' – How are they handled?



✓ Positive results expedited through the process; referring provider notified as soon as possible.

- ✓ In case provider cannot be identified, patient will be referred to partnering hospital for treatment; transportation provided by Project Renewal.
- \checkmark Re-takes will be scheduled as needed
